Евгений Кандиларов е доктор по история, България е на Историческия факултет на СУ "Св. Климент Охридски", а следва през 2002 г. завършил бакалавърска степен със специализация по нов и съвременна обща история, а през 2003 г. защитава магистърска теза на тема "Електронна промишленост в японическата политика на България през 50-те - 80-те години на XX век".
 От 2007 г. е доцент-доцент към катедрата по История на България, със специална наредба на японската фирма "Токио Санавай" - "The Tokyo Sankai" чрез "Jobbes Follow-up Fund Program, Japan Foundation". През 2005 г. специализира в чужбина Факултета по политически науки и икономика на университета "Мейджи", Токио. През 2006 година защитава докторат по съвременна българска история. Работил като сарудник в Центъра за исторически и политически изследвания и като асистент преподавател в ИФ на СУ "Св. Климент Охридски". Научните му интереси са насочени към проблемите на политическото и стопанското развитие на България след Втората световна война и към българската външна политика в контекста на международните отношения между Изтока и Запада в годините на Студената война.
 Монографията е посветена на политическите, икономическите и културните връзки между България и Япония след Втората световна война. Използването на японски език в статията на Студената война подготвя автора да потърси по-честни прегледи, фактори и мотиви за тяхното развитие. Заедно с това се търсят отговори на въпроса защо в годините на превода отношенията между двете страни избухват рязко следва дванадесет години.
 Книгата е изградена на базата на богат документален материал от архивни и лични архиви, публикувани списания и интервюта на автора с български и японски дипломати, учени и културни дейци, участници в описаните събития.

Защо през Студената война, когато България и Япония са най-верни съюзници на противостоещите супер сили - СССР и САЩ, българо-японските отношения следват своя логика, която не винаги съвпада с политиката на Москва и Вашингтон? Защо световното изложение "Експо 70" така силно впечатлява Тодор Живков? С какво то повлиява на представите му за социалистическата система и за развитието на България? Верно ли е, че в Япония думата "България" е синоним на кисело мляко? Как Детският радиодвор на маестро Христо Неделков омалкосва японската публика вече повече от 40 години? Случайно ли българинът Калоян Макленов (Катошу) се превърнал в своеобразна японска икона на суното? Защо голяма част от българската литературна класа вече превърнала в Страната на изправеното слънце? Мислите ли България да се превърне в "Япония на Балканите" и защо това не се случил?
 В тази книга авторът се опитва да даде отговори на тези и много други въпроси.
